25 In Moscow in Russia, there are 35,000 wild dogs. The dogs live in parks, old
houses and train stations. Many people in Moscow like the dogs. They give them
food and water. Some people make small houses for the dogs in their gardens.
This helps the dogs in very cold Russian winters.

We must stop animals from coming into the city so they don't get hurt.
