

FRIEDRICHSHAFEN (Wurttemberg)

47° 40' N. 9° 30' E:

Friedrichshafen is on the Northern shore of Lake Constance at the junction of the railway lines from Lindau and from Ulm which run together westwards from Friedrichshafen to Basle. It is a railway centre of some importance.

Industrially Friedrichshafen is probably the most important town of its size in Germany. It is the seat of four very large engineering works; the Dornier Werke G.m.b.H., Maybach Motorenbau G.m.b.H., Luftschiffbau Zeppelin G.m.b.H., and the Zahnradfabrik Friedrichshafen A.G. These are situated at, or in the immediate vicinity of Friedrichshafen proper and are supplemented by a number of small engineering plants scattered throughout the area.
