What is above the waterline is the result of what is below. The obvious aspects of a culture are the result of the hidden ones.

You may be able to watch unknown religious rituals, for example, but you may not be aware of the beliefs that they express.

INSIGHT: What you see and hear is the result of ideas, values and social norms that are so well-known and accepted that in everyday life they are not discussed.

They would only be explained to children and defended only in a major crisis.
