## Some useful phrases for the president of the Convention:

 $\rightarrow$  to ask the people to be quiet:

"Order, order, I call this house to order."

 $\rightarrow$  to open the session:

"In the name of the French people, I hereby declare the trial open. Louis, who has called himself 'King of France', is indicted of being guilty of many crimes in order to create a tyranny and of destroying the people's liberty."

 $\rightarrow$  to ask the prosecution to speak:

"I now call upon the prosecution to make its case / to reply."

 $\rightarrow$  to ask the defence to speak:

"I now call upon the defence to make its case / to reply."

 $\rightarrow$  to ask the members of the Convention to give their verdict:

"I now call upon the honourable members of the Convention here present to pronounce their verdict. Those who <u>are</u> convinced that Louis is guilty, please indicate this by raising your hands now." (counting the votes) – "Those who <u>are</u> <u>not</u> convinced that Louis is guilty, please indicate this by raising your hands now." (counting the votes) "

→ pronouncing the final verdict:

"In the name of the French people, I declare Louis <u>guilty</u> / <u>not guilty</u> of many crimes in order to create a tyranny and of destroying the people's liberty."
